



Application For Involuntary/Emergency Evaluation Rejection

Name of Proposed Patient: Elliot Doe

Based on the review of the Application for Involuntary Evaluation or the Application for Emergency Admission for Evaluation, the application fails to provide evidence to sufficiently justify an involuntary evaluation or an emergency evaluation due to:

The petitioner has not established that the patient is an imminent danger to himself or to others. Additionally, the petitioner has not established that the patient has a mental health disorder (such as delusional thinking) and that the patient refusing to answer the petitioner's questions does not demonstrate disorganized thoughts. Per the petitioner's report, the emergency responders have checked on this patient and have reportedly stated that the patient has a right to chose to be homeless and refuse help. The police were called a second time (per facebook collateral) and stated that they spoke to him and he doesn't want any help from them [police] either. Per the petitioner's collateral from a facebook posting, the patient was seen with a "case of water, sleeping gear and supplies".

The petitioner states that the patient "refused assistance", however the collateral the petitioner submitted with the petition described that he had supplies available to him. He does have clothes and gear. Therefore, patient is currently not meeting the criteria per T36 definitions and cannot be held involuntarily. Patient would benefit from outpatient mental health assessment and treatment. This risk is unfortunately not modifiable on an acute inpatient basis.

If there is additional information, then the petitioner is encouraged to re-petition the patient.

Therefore, this application is being rejected. The application and reason for rejection will be maintained for six months.
